WHAT IS STEPPING STONES?

Stepping Stones encourages active citizenship by helping grassroots community members undertake small creative projects that build a sense of inclusive belonging in their local communities in Calgary and area. We offer grant support of up to \$1,000 for project expenses.

Stepping Stones supports projects that:

- Build connections between people and their local neighbourhoods and communities.
- Celebrate the importance of knowing neighbours through the joys and struggles of regular daily life and in times of community stress.
- Are driven by people in their own neighbourhoods and communities. The projects often differ from programs provided by organizations because community members play a meaningful leadership role. The projects are with and by community members, not for.

Projects we support:

- Engage people in creative ways to build connections and/or to address shared concerns
- Foster a sense of pride and presence
- Give people the chance to get involved in community life
- Think inclusively about their community's diversity and work creatively to involve people from whom involvement is difficult

Examples:

- A community association runs a free photography club for neighbourhood youth to talk about what they like in their area and what they'd like to improve
- A cultural association runs a storytelling session between seniors and youth to share knowledge and build connections
- A group gets permission to build a garden on public land and needs help to buy plant stock and refreshments for a volunteer gardening day or workshop

WHO CAN APPLY?

Charitable organizations (qualified doneesⁱ), when they support grassroots community members to lead the project

Non-profit societies registered with the Alberta or Federal government for the purpose of community good

Informal grassroots groups that are not registered, so long as they work with a charity or non-profit society on the project and application

Please note: All projects must be rooted in and serve the people of Calgary and areaⁱⁱ.

STEPPING STONES CANNOT COVER

- Projects that have occurred before the application decision is made.
- Salary, equipment that could be borrowed, or items that could be donated by other sources.
- Purchase of assets (computers, cameras, etc.) for individuals, informal groups, or nonprofits
- Expenses of individual people, such as their home rental or utility bills.
- Projects of condo associations or business/professional associations
- Religious services, proselytizing, or the promotion of one faith tradition
- Projects that are primarily fundraisers or that charge a significant ticket fee
- Activities that do not align with Calgary Foundation's stated values
